Sister Ann attended the conference dinner. My wife, mother and I had the privilege of driving Sister to the Dinner.

Sister Ann wants to address our Council at a Social meeting this Fall as a guest speaker. She was impressed with the State Conference.

Amherst also from Division 5 was the top Council in the State. This is based on filing of timely and complete reports and meeting their quota of new members.

The State Council is starting a JUNE push for members. They are close to 60,000 members for the State. They are 222 short and have planned a program starting June 1<sup>st</sup>. Ending June 30<sup>th</sup>. For All Councils that sign up 5 new members, have the opportunity to win \$25, \$50 or \$1000. Plus the sponsor will have an opportunity to win a FREE trip to the Supreme Conference in Nashville in August. This will not help us with the State stuff, but will help us with Supreme, PLUS we get a chance to win \$1000.

We have some potential new members. I have one. Scott has a few. (Joe Miller of Amherst has 2.) So the degree will have some numbers.

There is a question of just holding a 1<sup>st</sup> Degree and/or a Second Degree in JUNE. As long as we get the Form 100's into Supreme prior to the end of June (which means FEX EX and a Phone call into Supreme Membership) and Supreme lists these new members on our 7/1 report, we qualify. Currently we are 15 new members out of a quota of 19!!!!!! This is the closest to making quota in 7 years.

We may have to hold the degrees on a Sunday. The earlier in June the better in order to make sure the forms are received by Supreme on time.

By asking a few fellow Catholics to join our ranks, we can make it. I am asking each of you to help me in this.

I would like to make sure our wonderful degree team will be in town. If not, we may need to go to another Council. But I am willing to make this final push. Please let me know your thoughts.

## *Duties of a Proposer*

*Proposing a new member is a commendable achievement and one to be proud of. However, as a proposer, turning over a completed Membership Document (#100) is not the end of the job. You must also take the responsibility to see that your recruit becomes fully accepted by his fellow council members and stays involved in council activities. There are several steps you can take to ensure this.*

- *Explain to him that the council's Admission Committee will examine his qualifications for membership and accompany him to the Admission Committee meeting. Introduce him to the members present.*
- *After he has been accepted, escort him to his First Degree and remain with him throughout the event. Following the exemplification, introduce him to his fellow council members.*
- *Take the newly initiated member and his family "under your wing". See that he learns council procedures, such as meeting times, committee assignments, etc. Introduce him and his family at council events. Encourage him to involve his family in council-sponsored activities.*
- *Accompany your recruit to his Second Degree and Third Degree exemplifications and stay with him throughout the day.*

*Contact him before each council meeting and bring him to the meeting if necessary. If the new member becomes inactivate for some reason, try to find out why. Call and ask to visit with him. Explain your concern about his absence and offer support or assistance.*

- *Encourage him to earn "Shining Armor" status within the council. If the Knight becomes inactive, his proposer should work with the retention committee to find out the reasons for his lapsed interest and try to converse his membership.*

*With a little personal effort you can help guarantee that your recruit becomes an active member of the Knights of Columbus.*

### **Knights**

Once a candidate completes the First Degree ceremony on the lesson of charity, he is considered a Knight of Columbus and can participate in all council activities. First Degree members are encouraged to attain the Second and Third Degrees, which teach the lessons of unity and fraternity. Upon taking the Third Degree, a member receives full honors of Knighthood and is "Knighthooded".

Privileges of Third Degree membership include the ability to serve as a local council officer, and admission to state and Supreme Council business meetings. First and Second Degree members can attend the state and Supreme Council meetings, but they are not allowed in the business sessions.
