Grand Knight Report...

November, if you think about it, is a month that focuses on thankfulness and remembrance. We celebrate Thanksgiving in a few weeks, a holiday that has been an annual tradition since 1863, when, during the Civil War, President Abraham Lincoln proclaimed a national day of "Thanksgiving and Praise to our beneficent Father who dwelleth in the Heavens". Of course we know that the first Thanksgiving to occur on American soil took place in 1621, and was celebrated by the Pilgrims after their first harvest in the New World.

With respect to remembrance, the Catholic Church celebrates All Souls Day, a day in which the whole of the

Catholic Church prays for deceased friends and family through the sacrifice of the Mass that they may achieve everlasting happiness in heaven.

In the last week of October, the meaning of thankfulness hit home when our council cooked a Mexican dinner for the residents of St. Joseph's Homeless Shelter in Lorain. (We have partnered with Holy Spirit Parish to cook meals on the 5th Tuesday of the months in which there are 5 and also New Years.) Think of what it must be like to have to depend on someone for a meal and a place to stay overnight and then

reflect on how blessed we are to have homes and family.

Also during the latter days of October our Council held it's Annual Memorial Mass for our deceased Brother Knights. Our Chaplain, Fr. Girard Gonda, celebrated the Mass in our Hall and was led to the altar by Sir Knights in full regalia. The ceremony is profound in that the words leading up to the reading of the names of the deceased reminds us that we are made in the image and likeness of God but we are mortal and imperfect unlike God. And because we are imperfect we need to pray for ourselves our families and for those who have preceded us.

This month our Council will hold the first of two Spiritual Retreats on Saturday, November 9. The retreat will be held at St. Andrew Abbey on Martin Luther King Blvd. in Cleve-

Meals Prepared for Homeless Shelter

On Oct. 29, Brothers Jim Bruder, Ted Rink, Henry Rodriguez and John Wesner, along with Isabella Lady's Mary Bliss, and Mary Jane Morog, prepared and donated a Mexican meal for the residents of the St. Joseph's Homeless Shelter in Lorain, Ohio. Our Chef for this meal, Henry Rodriguez guided each of his helpers in the preparation of the meal. The meal consisted of

beef Burritos, refried beans, Mexican rice, tossed salad, and chips and Salsa. The picture to the left shows the Burrito assembly line. The meal prepared was enough to feed 75 residents and helpers at the home. We have partnered with Holy Spirit Parish to feed residents of the shelter on Tuesdays of each month with our turn coming in months with a 5th week and Christmas.

In the future the Council will prepare meals for the shelter on Christmas Eve, New Years Eve and one more time on April 29th.
